#### Permits are required for all residents and visitors in Wildwood HOA

- \$2.00 per permit
- \$1.00 for visitor permit (1 pass maximum)
- \$25.00 for additional visitor permit
- \$50.00 for a replacement visitor permit

#### Items needed to obtain parking permit:

- Lease or proof of screening
- Valid government issued I.D (state, driver license, military, etc.)
- Proof of vehicle registration

We have guest parking spaces set aside for your friends and family when they visit. Since these spaces are limited, we need to make sure guest parking is used by visitors only. To help with this. Everyone parked in a guest space must have a guest parking permit.

#### Our guest parking rules:

Visitors may park for up to 24 hours in any 7 day period. Residents are not permitted to park in guest spaces.

**Note**: We can provide special permits if we decide an exception is warranted, so please contact us if you have extenuating circumstances.




#### Baked Parmesan Garlic Chicken

#### Ingredients:

- 4 Boneless Skinless Chicken Breasts
- 1 package Dry Italian Dressing Packet
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/2 cup grated parmesan cheese

(You can also use fresh shredded which I used)



- 1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees.
- 2. Mix together the Italian Dressing Mix, Parmesan Cheese, and garlic powder.
- 3. Wash chicken and while still damp, coat them with the cheese mixture.
- 4. Bake chicken breasts in shallow dish for 20-25 minutes or until no longer pink.

#### Fried Zucchini Coins Pasta

#### Ingredients:

- 1 Pound Dried Bow Tie Pasta
- 4-5 Small to Medium Zucchini
- Bunch of Fresh, Washed, Chopped Parsley
- 3/4 Cup Fresh Grated Parmesan Cheese
- 1/4 Cup Olive Oil
- 2 Large garlic Cloves, Minced
- Fresh Ground Pepper
- Dash of Salt
- Dash of Red Pepper Flakes (Optional)

#### Directions:

- 1. Slice the zucchini into coins, and fry in the olive oil until golden brown. Drain on paper towels.
- 2. Add the garlic and remove before it browns.
- 3. Cook the pasta until al dente, reserving a small cup of the pasta water before draining. Drain the pasta, and add the zucchini to the hot pasta with a little of the water.
- 4. Mix thoroughly over medium heat, adding the cracked black pepper and red pepper flakes if you are using them.
- 5. Remove from the heat and add the fresh, chopped parsley and half the cheese. Mix well and serve, offering the additional cheese for on top of the pasta.



#### Non Op Vehicles

Non op cars are vehicles that cannot be driven due to tags/flat tire etc.

These vehicles are not to be found in any garages within Morrison Creek.

Garages are for operable vehicles only.

If a non op vehicle is found in a unit's garage within Morrison Creek the association does have the right tow that vehicle.

#### Balcony Reminder

Decks are to be maintained in a neat and orderly fashion. Items allowed on decks are limited to lawn furniture and no more than 10 potted plants not exceeding 9 inches in diameter. Plants must be in proper planters with the proper containers to catch excessive water slow. There may not be any other furniture, or refrigerators or other appliances of any kind located on any deck. There shall be no mops, brooms, buckets, kitchen chairs, dining room chairs or broken chairs on any balcony. Residents are not to hang wet clothes or towels or any other form of laundry on the balcony.

## City Tackles Illegal Dumping of Junk and Debris New Reward Program Unveiled

Launching RID - Report Illegal Dumping campaign. Rewards between \$500 and

\$1,000 are now available to citizens who report illegal dumping.

**More Info:** The City of Sacramento is cracking down on illegal dumpers. The RID campaign encourages citizens to report illegal dumping and offers generous rewards if the information leads to a citation or a conviction.

City staff will display surveillance equipment used in the last three months to identify and catch illegal dumpers. There will be a photo array of some of the dumping caught on camera.

As part of the event, a city crew will clean up the dumpsite.

Live interviews for noon newscasts can be accommodated.
